Regular Meeting
October 14th, 2025

Mayor N Flack called the Meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. Roll was answered by J. Parisi, D. Brotherton, J. Marcotte, E. Murphy, L. Zigler. Also in attendance were Police Chief T. Wand, Village Clerk N. Ritchie, Attorney T. Kurt and Zoning Admin C. Henkins.

Mayor N Flack Installed D. Schaible to fill the vacant board Trustee position. Attorney T. Kurt swore in D. Schaible to Village Board Trustee.

E. Murphy motioned to accept the meeting minutes for the September 9th, 2025 regular meeting. L. Zigler seconded. Motion passed 6-0.

L. Zigler motioned to pay the monthly bills. J. Parisi seconded. Motion passed 6-0.

D. Schaible motioned to accept the Treasurer's report. J. Marcotte seconded. Motion passed 6-0.

2025 Motor Fuel Project Construction Payment - was discussed and approved in the monthly bills.

2025 Motor Fuel Project - Fehr Graham Payment - discussion was had on the motor fuel money payments of \$465,516.23. Mayor Flack said the cost of the project came in \$26,678.22 below bid. This was due to adjustments of roadway edge repairs as determined in the field.

Fiber Report - The Fiber Main box (phase one) installation that will feed fiber to individual residents is near completion.

Committee Reports/Comments - Copper and Lead testing July thru September came back well under testing regulations.

Cross Connection (backflow) testing is up to date for compliance.

Zoning - 2 building permits issued 1- fence 1- shed.

8390 Rt 84 S. - was issued another ticket for ordinance violations. The property is scheduled for a building inspection due to structural issues.

Police Reports - Police Chief reported addressing issues of ordinance compliance of vehicles/ garbage and yard maintenance.

105-107 Jefferson - No new updates.

2121 W Hanover Rd - Progress is being made on the plans for the property.

Board Comments - Correction was made on the August Minutes in a typo from p.m. to a.m. in the Liquor ordinance description. The ordinance was correct.

Mayor Flack discussed the Lagoon having an island in it after water levels have come down and revealed it. Dredging of the Lagoon will need to happen. Bridget with Fehr Graham has found a grant to help fund the 1.5 million dollar project. Mayor Flack also informed the board that the Village was donated a sewer crawler.
